NCREDC	Capacity Building Grants Program funds typically are used to prepare preliminary engineering reports.	
NCREDC	Unsewered Communities Grants Program provides funding for the planning and construction of new central, publicly owned sewer systems.	
NCREDC	The Community Economic Development Grants Program provides funds to minority community development corporations to improve the economy and quality of life in their communities. Grants are used by the CDCs to provide business loans, revitalize commercial districts, long-term community planning, and other activities tailored to local needs. NCCGL	The Clean Water State Revolving Loan Fund (CWSRF) provides grant funds to establish revolving loan programs to assist in the funding of wastewater treatment facilities and projects associated with estuary and nonpoint source programs.	Amy Simes (919) 715-6217 amy.simes@ncmail.net

Golden Leaf, Inc	Economic Impact Assistance Grants are for economically affected or tobacco-dependent areas of North Carolina. The Foundation funds programs that promote or sustain economic development, such as job training, economic hardship assistance, public works, industrial recruiting, and community assistance. NCDENR	Water Resources Development Project Grant Program is designed to provide cost-share grants and technical assistance to local governments throughout the State. Applications for grants are accepted for : General Navigation, Recreational Navigation, Water Management, Stream Restoration, Beach Protection, Land Acquisition and Facility Development for Water-Based Recreation, and Aquatic Weed Control. Division of Pollution Prevention and Environmental Assistance which is used to make small grants in support of waste reduction efforts.
