Community Grant and Loan Resources

There is a variety of infrastructure-funding programs for North Carolina facilities providers. The following is an effort to help municipalities be aware of the many venues of monies available. This table is not meant to be all-inclusive, but will alert you to some resources for grants and low cost loans.

NCREDC	Capacity Building Grants Program funds typically are used to prepare preliminary engineering reports.	
NCREDC	Unsewered Communities Grants Program provides funding for the planning and construction of new central, publicly owned sewer systems	
NCCGL	The Clean Water State Revolving Loan Fund (CWSRF) provides grant funds to establish revolving loan programs to assist in the funding of wastewater treatment facilities and projects associated with estuary and nonpoint source programs.	Amy Simes (919) 715-6217 amy.simes@ncmail.net
CDBG	Infrastructure provides grants to local governments to improve existing infrastructure or provide new infrastructure.	Vickie Miller CDBG Program Development Section (919) 733-2850
USDARD	Technical Assistance and Training Grants are used to identify and evaluate solutions to water and waste disposal problems in rural areas, and to improve operation and maintenance of existing water and waste disposal systems in rural areas. USDARD	Water & Waste Disposal Loans and Grants provide funds for community water, sewer, storm sewer and solid waste systems.	
USDARD	Solid Waste Management Grants are available to reduce or eliminate pollution of water resources and to improve planning and management of solid waste sites.	
USDARD	Emergency Community Water Assistance Grants are available to assist applicants in obtaining water that meets standards set by the Safe Drinking Water Act where there has been a significant decline in quantity or quality within 2 years of application.
